Introduction

The Construction Site Managers certificate issued by IOSH is recognised nationally and international and identifies the holder as having been instructed in proactive approaches to managing health, safety and welfare.

The course covers the basics in health and safety management in a high impact interactive format, whilst giving management the tools to introduce new workplace controls, implement sensible changes and reduce workplace risks.

Course Duration

Construction Site Managers is for managers and supervisors within the construction/civils sector, and any organisation. It is designed to get managers up to speed on the practical actions they need to take to handle health and safety in their teams.

Certification and Assessment
